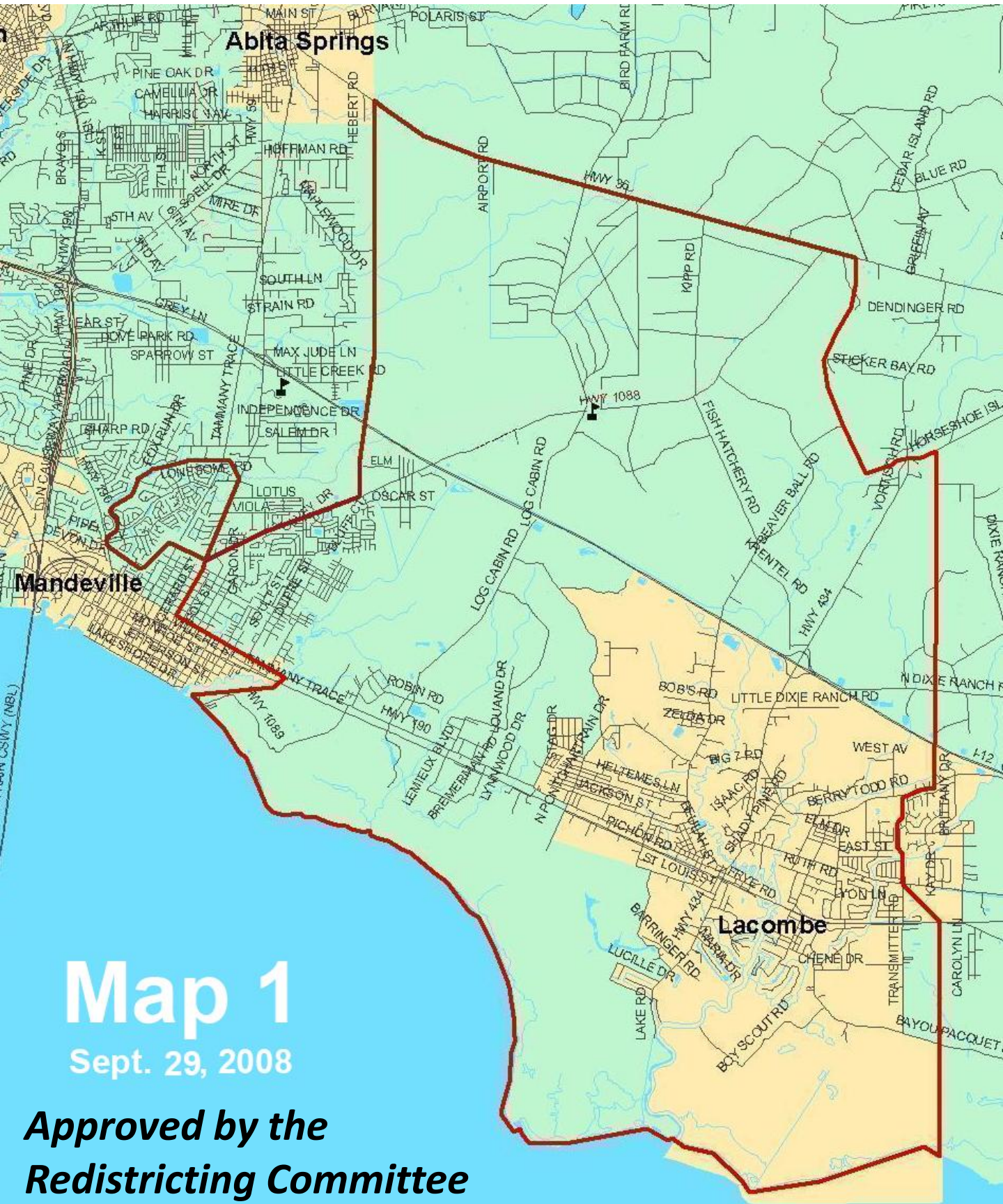

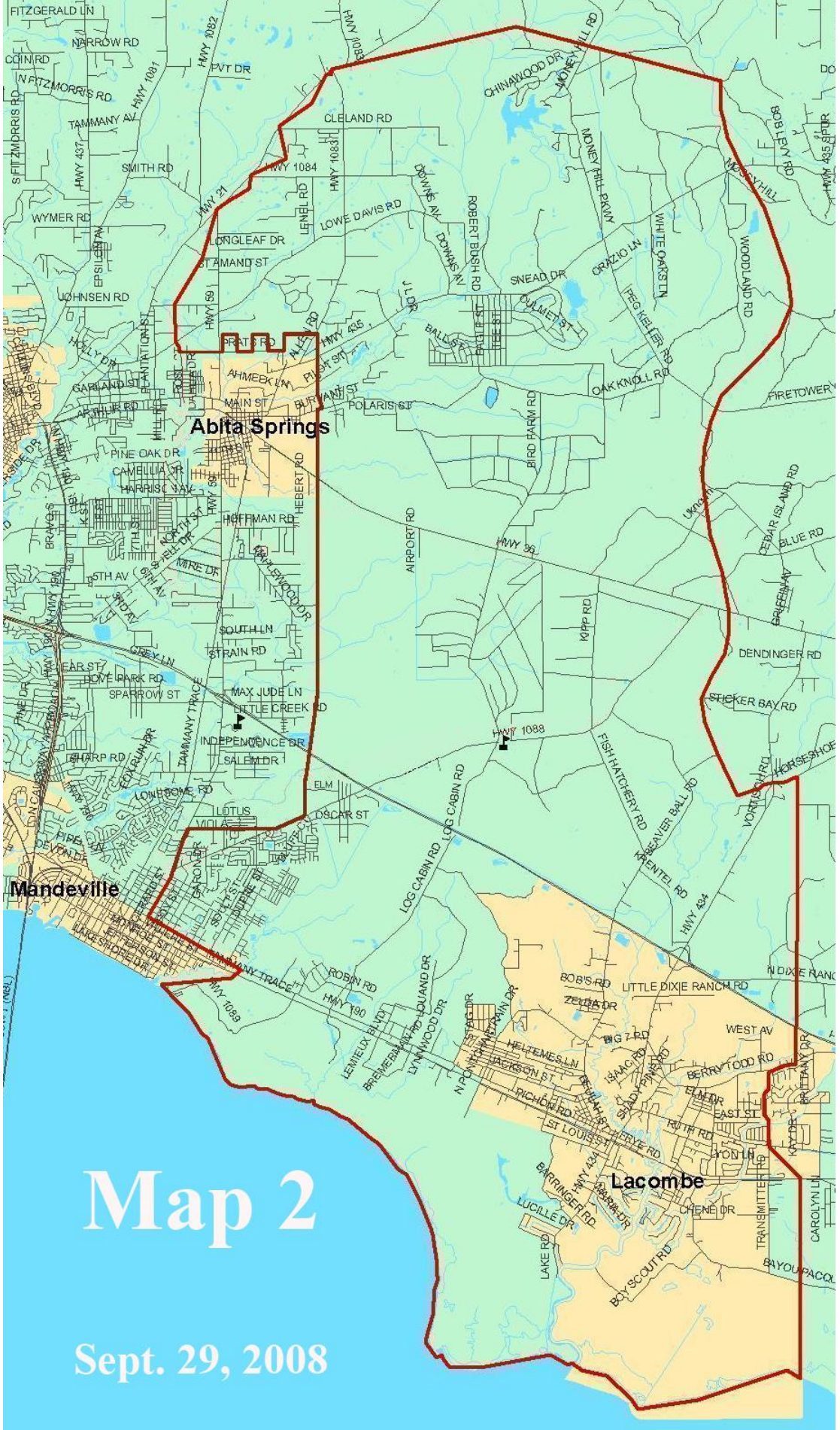

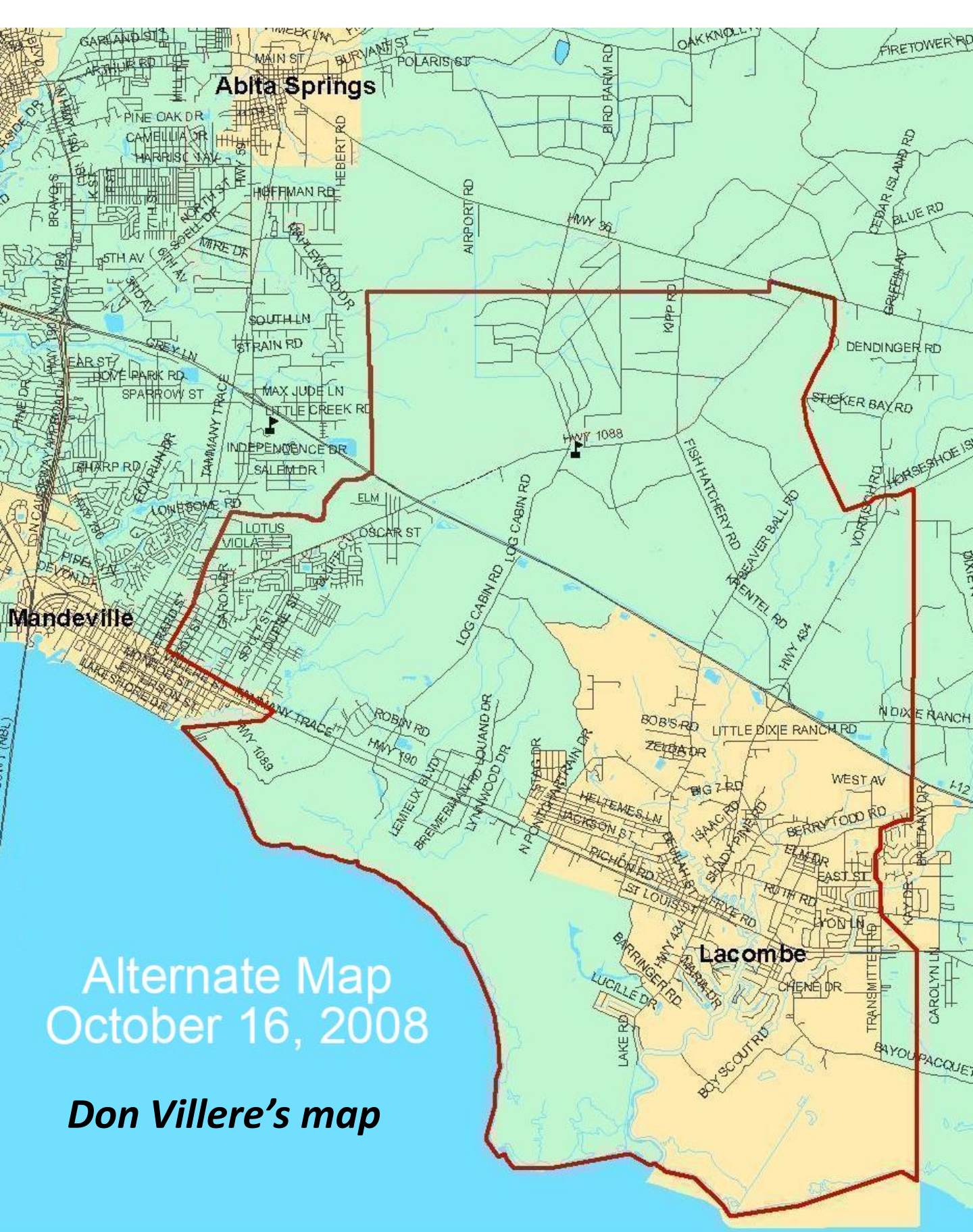

Description of Data Collection to Determine Student Enrollment for all three Maps

Data Collection Source

For accuracy, STPSB school principals at all feeder schools (Fontainebleau High School, Fontainebleau Junior High School, Monteleone Junior High School, Abita Middle School, Bayou Lacombe Middle School, Lake Harbor Middle School, and Mandeville Middle School) were asked to print each of the three maps being considered by the Board. Each principal was asked to look at the grade level which students would attend based on the three maps and review the class student by student. In looking at each individual student's address, they were to submit the total population for each map based on ethnicity and socioeconomic status. As of the October 15, 2008 date, principals divided class data into FHS or New High School for each map. Fontainebleau High School examined grade nine; Fontainebleau and Monteleone Junior Highs examined grades eight and seven; Abita Middle, Bayou Lacombe, Lake Harbor, and Mandeville Middle Schools examined grade six. This information provides a total population at both high schools for grades nine through twelve within the next three years. The projection for both high schools is based on the current students in the feeder schools. All data is based on existing students in the STPSB system as of October 15, 2008. Future growth in the area and student retention due to failing grades were not factored into the raw number system used to populate both high schools.

The process for redistricting began in August 2008. The committee used data that had rolled over from the previous school year to begin the redistricting process. This was necessary so that the committee could make a recommendation to the School Board in a timely fashion. As the current school year progressed, current data was available for use in the calculation of the populations of Fontainebleau High and the New High School. The final calculations located on the website reflect the most current, up-to-date information available.
